





Figure 1. Output Characteristics




Figure 2. Output Characteristics




Figure 3. Output Characteristics




Figure 4. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 5. Saturation Characteristics




Figure 6. Saturation Voltage vs. Junction Temperature




Figure 7. Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 8. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 9. Switching Time vs Gate Resistance




Figure 10. Switching Time vs Gate Resistance




Figure 11. Switching Loss vs Gate Resistance




Figure 12. Switching Loss vs Gate Resistance




Figure 13. Switching Time vs Collector Current




Figure 14. Switching Time vs Collector Current




Figure 15. Switching Loss vs Collector Current




Figure 16. Switching Loss vs Collector Current




Figure 17. Diode Forward Characteristics




Figure 18. Diode Reverse Recovery Current




Figure 19. Diode Reverse Recovery Energy




Figure 20. Diode Stored Charge Characteristics




Figure 21. Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT






Figure 22. Transient Thermal Impedance of Diode
